

MEDICAID IN LONG ISLAND

Included Counties: Nassau, Suffolk

- Medicaid pays hospitals and nursing homes less than the actual cost of the care they deliver
- This puts severe financial strain on institutions that serve vulnerable, low-income patients
- Fully funding New York's Medicaid program will help stabilize safety net hospitals and reduce healthcare disparities
- 100% of New York's recently adopted Managed Care Organization (MCO) tax must go to healthcare, especially considering the looming federal threat to Medicare and Medicaid funding

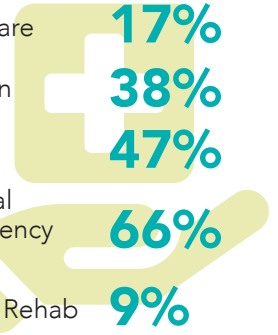
