

MEDICAID IN CENTRAL NEW YORK

Included Counties: Cayuga, Cortland, Madison, Onondaga, Oswego

- Medicaid pays hospitals and nursing homes less than the actual cost of the care they deliver
- This puts severe financial strain on institutions that serve vulnerable, low-income patients
- The Trump administration's historic Medicaid cuts could cause hospital closures and major job losses and impact the quality of care
- New York's leaders must allocate at least \$2 billion in the state budget to replace federal funding losses and stabilize our healthcare system
